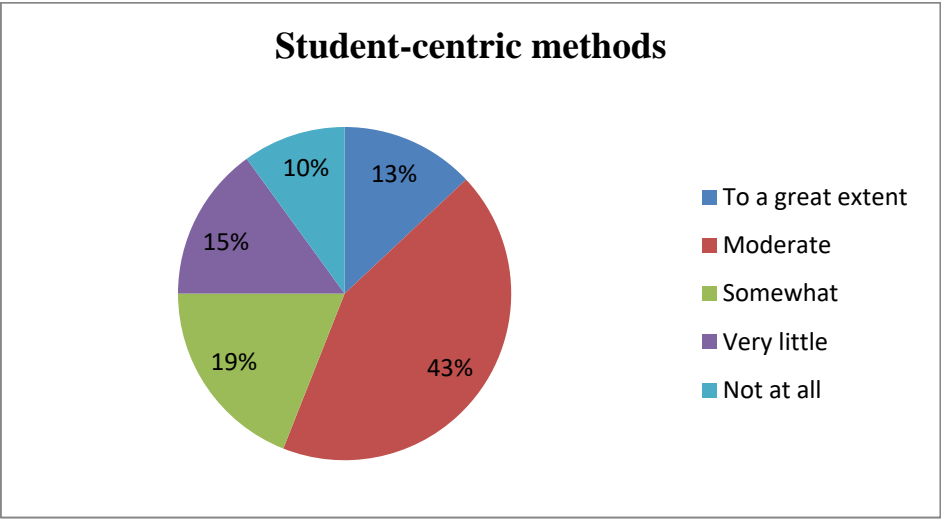

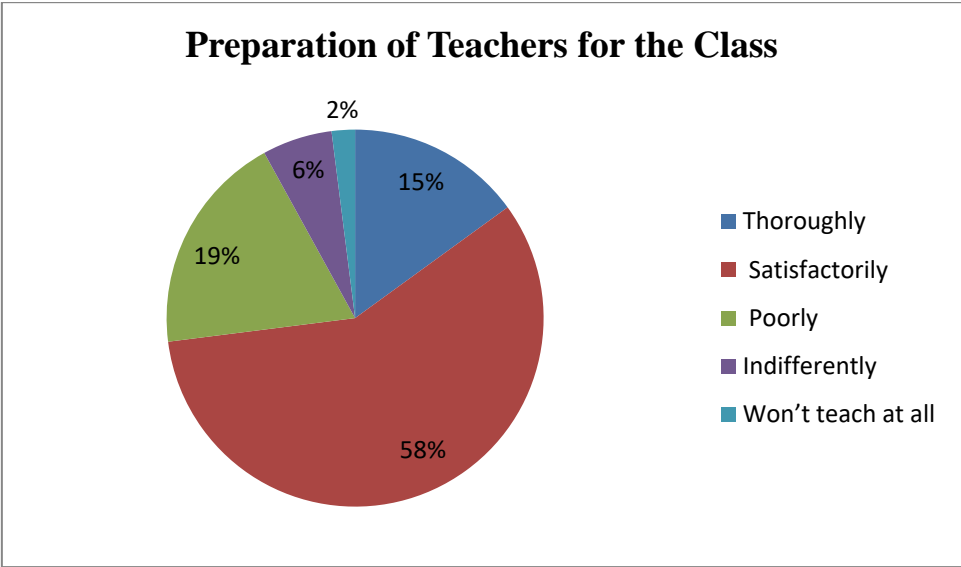

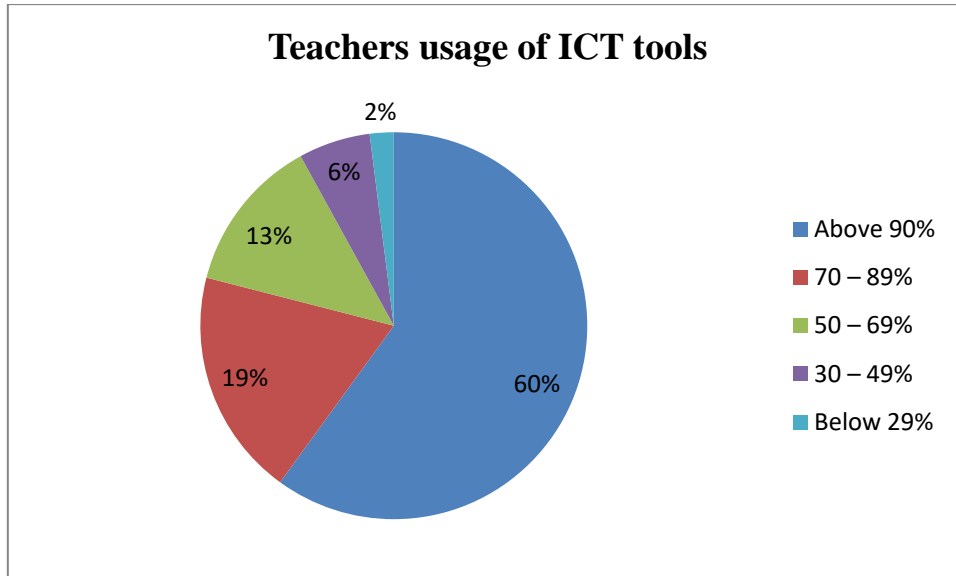
2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

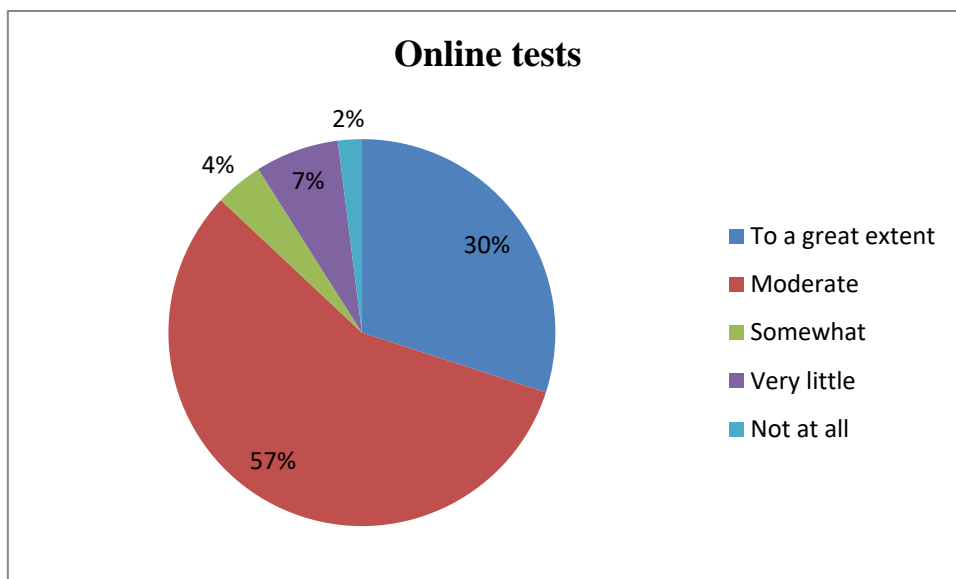
3. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching?

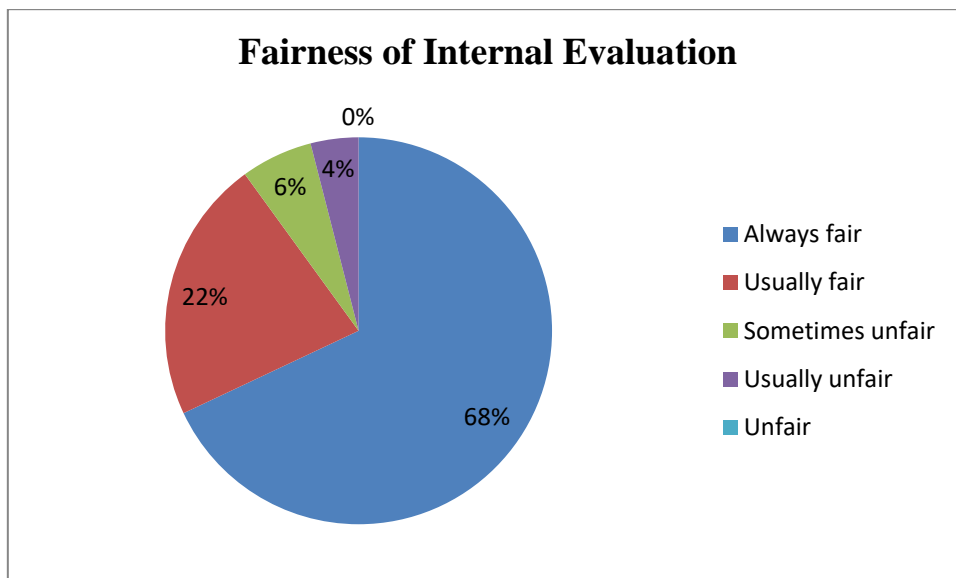
4. Were you able to take up online unit tests and model exams at ease?

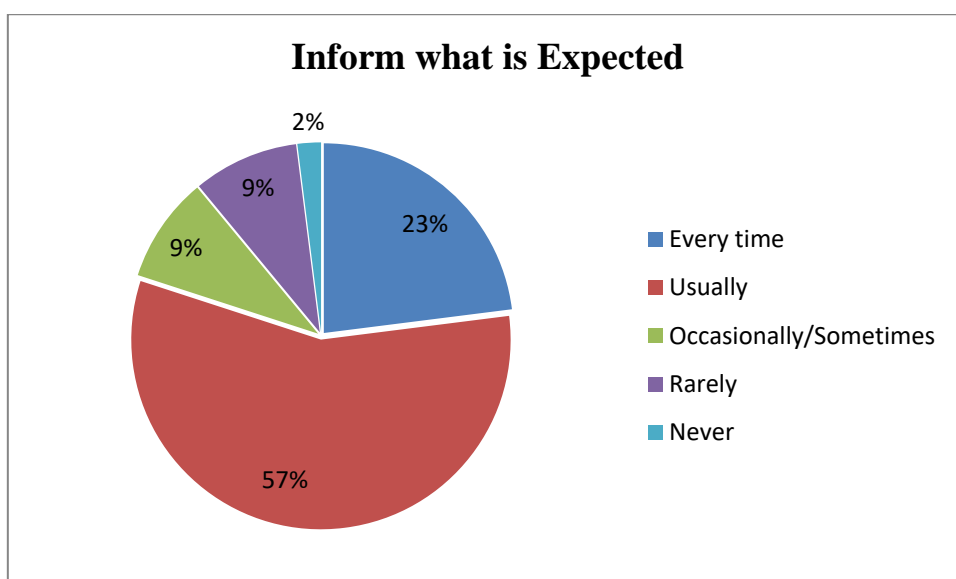
5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers

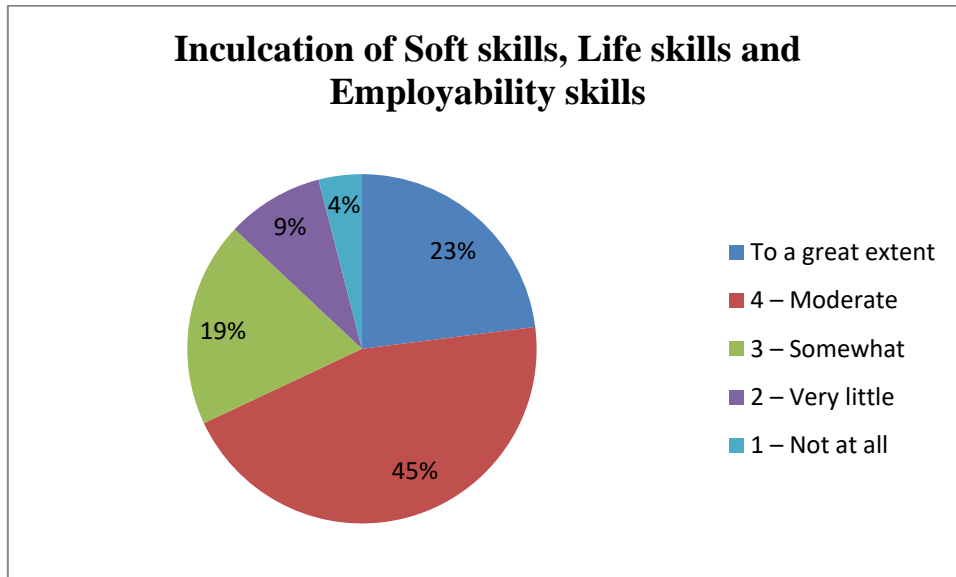

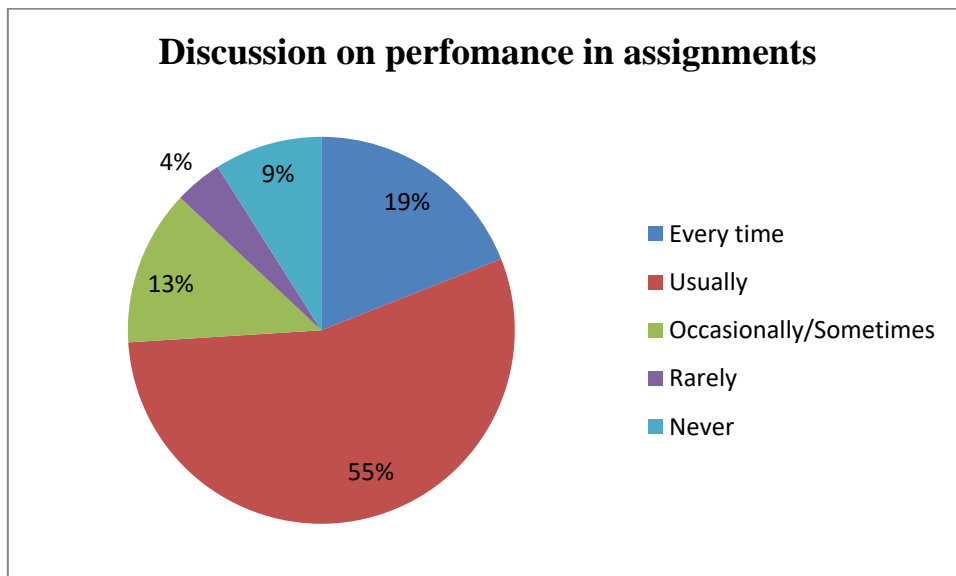

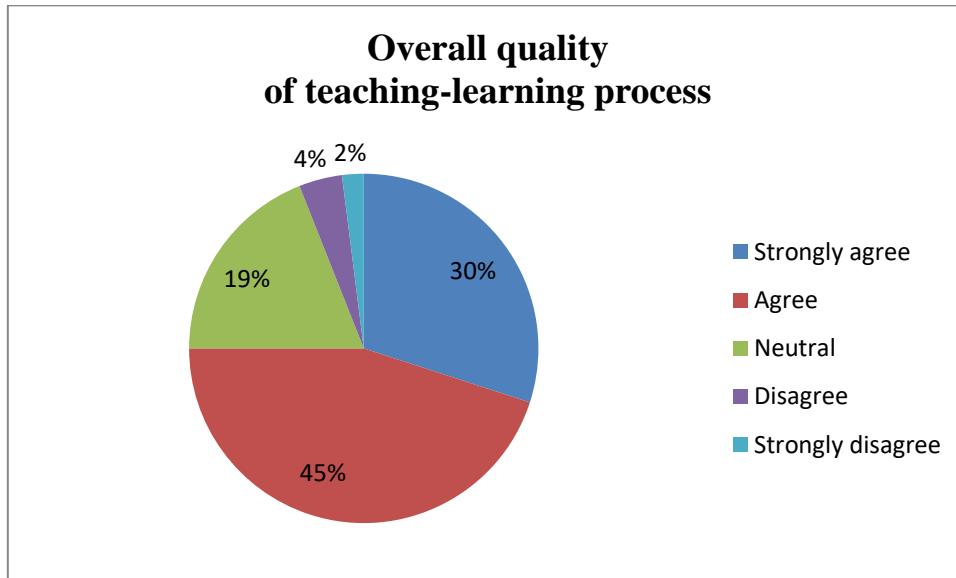
8. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?
